

HOLY BAPTISM OF OLIVER CREW SMITH

(Candidate for baptism, sponsors, and parents gather with the minister at the font.)

PRESENTATION

God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the Sacrament of Baptism. The power of sin is put to death in this holy flood, and we are raised with Jesus Christ to new life. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and sent out in mission for the life of the world.

Pastor: Erika & Clint, whom do you present to receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism?

Parents: We present Oliver Crew Smith for baptism.

As you present this child for baptism, you are entrusted with gifts and responsibilities: to live with him among God's faithful people, bring him faithfully to the word of God and the Holy Supper, place in his hands the Holy Scriptures, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments and nurture him in faith and prayer, so that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace among all people.

Erika & Clint, do you promise to help your child grow in the Christian faith and life?

Parents: We do.

Jason & Jamie, do you promise to nurture Oliver Crew in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Sponsors: We do.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly:

People of God, do you promise to support *Oliver Crew* and pray for him in his new life in Christ?

We do.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The presiding minister addresses the congregation:

I ask you to reject sin, profess your faith in Christ, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? I renounce them.

With the whole church, let us confess our faith.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

THANKSGIVING

Blessed are you, O God, maker and ruler of all things. Your voice thundered over the waters at creation. You water the mountains and send springs into the valleys to refresh and satisfy all living things. Through the waters of the flood, you carried those in the ark to safety. Through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery to freedom. In the wilderness you nourished them with water from the rock, and you brought them across the river Jordan to the promised land.

By the baptism of his death and resurrection, your Son Jesus has carried us to safety and freedom. The floods shall not overwhelm us, and the deep shall not swallow us up, for Christ has brought us over to the land of promise. He sends us to make disciples, baptizing in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Pour out your Holy Spirit; wash away sin in this cleansing water; clothe the baptized with Christ; and claim your daughters and sons, no longer slave and free, no longer male and female, but one with all the baptized in Christ Jesus, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

BAPTISM

Oliver Crew, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

The newly baptized receives a baptismal garment and the following is said:

You have been clothed in Christ. All who are baptized have put on Christ.

Let us pray,

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your son new birth, wash him from sin, and raise him to eternal life. Sustain *Oliver Crew* with the gift of your Holy Spirit:

the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. **Amen.**

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized.

Oliver Crew, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. **Amen.**

WELCOME

A lighted candle is given to the newly baptized saying:

Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven. **Amen.**

Let us pray.

O God, the giver of all life, look with kindness upon the father and mother of this child. Let them ever rejoice in the gift you have given them. Make them teachers and examples of righteousness for their child. Strengthen them in their own baptism so they may share eternally with their child the salvation you have given them through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The minister and the baptismal group face the assembly:

Through baptism you have been received into the household of God, entrusted with the good news of Jesus Christ, and strengthened to serve by the holy and life-giving Spirit.

We welcome you into the body of Christ and the mission we share. Join us as we give praise to God and bear God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.




