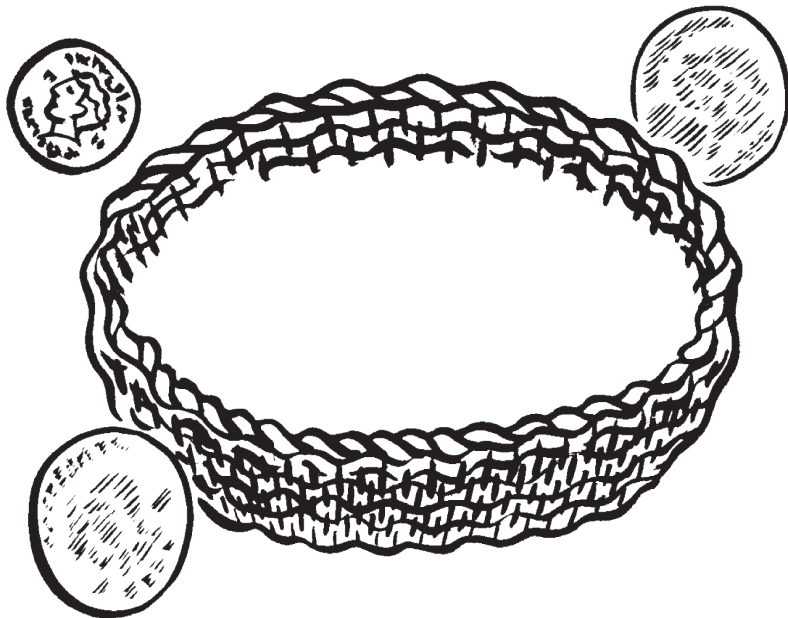


Our Offerings

- Today is the 20th Sunday after Pentecost.
- The **season after Pentecost** is sometimes called Ordinary Time.
- **Ordinary Time** doesn't mean that Pentecost is boring.
- Ordinary Time means Pentecost is an ordinal, or **counting**, time.

Matthew 22:15-22

Did you hear it in today's gospel? "Give to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's." OK—what things are God's? Have you ever thought about it?

The Bible begins with an answer to that question. In creation God separated light from darkness. In the light we can see all the things God made. Look at the pictures.

Color what you see that is new in each frame.
