# Trindle Spring Lutheran Church Council Meeting May 8, 2018 (Draft)

### CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm. In attendance were: Robin Cleaver, Myra Badorf, Joe Ricci, Pastor Aaron, Pastor Sigrid, Clark Eichelberger, Sherry Stoner, John Talton, Brian Keister, Carlotta Strohl, Ruth Knaub, Bobby Phillips and David Boose.

Absent: Erica Reinfeld Special guest: Cole Genchur

### **DEVOTIONS**

Devotions were offered by Pastor Aaron, based upon John 17:6-19. This is a passage in which John relates a prayer of Christ to God the Father seeking protection for the disciples. Pastor asked council to identify how that passage speaks to our calling. Pastor noted that Jesus asks that his disciples be sanctified in truth. He suggested that as disciples we are made holy which sets us apart from the world. Yet, we have to be in the world and bearers of the truth to the world. Pastor challenged us to think about what it means to in the world but not of the world.

### REVIEW OF MARCH 2018 COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Motion to accept the minutes as submitted made by Sherry Stoner. Seconded by John Talton. Motion APPROVED.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

Sherry Stoner provided a review of the written reports submitted by the Congregation Treasurer. Sherry noted that the April income and expenditures were in the red by approximately 800 dollars. She noted that expenses are considerably ahead of where we were last year; however, she noted that we have had several extraordinary expenses such as the video system and the purchase of a new riding mower. She asked that everyone remind their committees to be attentive to expenses and remain budget conscious. Sherry also reminded council that we will be having a congregational meeting following the June 3<sup>rd</sup> church service to address the capital needs campaign.

We do not have a Vision of Ministry report to review. However, it was noted that all Ansell bonds have been retired. The roof bonds will begin to be paid off in August.

The treasurer's report was accepted, subject to audit.

### LEAD PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Aaron provided a written report. He noted that without a cleaning crew we also do not have a set-up crew. He asked for help in setting up for an outside group. Pastor called attention to the fact that we have been having on-going problems with the sound system. We are working on finding a resolution.

### ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S REPORT

Pastor Sigrid submitted her written report. She high-lighted the programs she is leading that will require her absence from the congregation on Sundays in the next few weeks. Pastor moved that the following confirmands be admitted to membership following their Affirmation of Baptism on May 20, 2018: Grace Corey, Elena Erdley, Cole Genchur, Tace Harris, Mekayla Reinfeld, and Sophia Swartley. Motion seconded by Carlotta Strohl. Motion APPROVED.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS/BUSINESS**

### **Church Security**

Robin Cleaver asked that members be attentive to church security when in the building for meetings. She noted that there have been incidents while committees were meeting that strangers were found wandering in the building.

### **Volunteer Opportunity**

Robin also noted that we need to be aware of the need for volunteers to help staff church events and activities. She challenged council to seek out individuals to ask to assist with the ministry of the congregation. She noted that the personal invitation is crucial to success in integrating members into the life of the congregation.

### **New Member Engagement**

Discussion was held about finding ways to incorporate members into the life of the congregation. It was noted that the Stewardship Committee is working on a series of videos to high-light various aspects of TSLC ministries.

### **Social Media**

Council engaged in a discussion of new ways to focus the posts on our Facebook page. Previously we consistently had a theme for each day of the week. Evangelism is exploring new themes going forward.

Permission will be sought to move forward with replacement of the carpeting and painting of the interior. The meeting will follow the first joint worship service. Robin Cleaver reminded everyone that CPR training will again be offered Monday, June 11<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday, June 12<sup>th</sup>.

Robin also suggested that we should again have regular blessings for those who are traveling during the summer months.

The Pastors encouraged everyone to submit their faith questions for the summer sermon series.

The meeting adjourned at 8:16 pm with the reciting of the Lord's Prayer.

### **Affirmation of Baptism**

On May 20, the Festival of Pentecost, our congregation witnessed as six of our youth affirmed the promises of their baptism. They have completed three years of confirmation, during which they have studied the Bible and the Small Catechism, learned about their own gifts, personalities and values, explored the liturgy and organization of the ELCA, and gained an understanding of stewardship. They have spent time developing relationships with each other and with faith mentors, and have given their time in service to the church and the community. They have completed projects that drew on the spiritual gifts, talents, and passions they had identified and contributed in some way to the life of the church. In countless ways, they have grown in their faith and discipleship, and they are ready to take this next step in their faith journeys. I'd like to recognize here each of these young people:

**Grace Corey** is completing eighth grade at Eagle View Middle School. For her project, she collected soccer balls, which will be donated in Ghana, where she and her family will be moving this summer for several years. This project drew on her love of soccer, which she has been playing for years, as well as her talent for organizing and her spiritual gift of leadership. Grace plans to continue to look for ways to be involved in church and in sharing her gifts in the world—we will all miss her and look forward to hearing about her adventures in Ghana!

**Elena Erdley** will be entering ninth grade at Mechanicsburg Area Senior High School next fall. In addition to artistic gifts, Elena also identified talents in working with and empowering others. She put these gifts and her passion for issues of social justice to use in her project, which was to organize a mental health fair here at TSLC, with an emphasis on suicide prevention. Those who attended received valuable information and resources from the speakers and booths that were set up. Going forward, Elena would like to serve at church in the areas of music and education.

**Cole Genchur** is a student at Mechanicsburg Area Senior High School, completing 9<sup>th</sup> grade this year. Cole's project involved collecting sneakers to donate to those in need. This project tapped into his giftedness, as serving others in hands-on ways is a big part of how Cole expresses his faith. He plans to continue to be regularly involved in the life of the congregation and to look for ways to make a difference in the lives of others both at church and in the world.

Tace Harris will be a freshman next year at Mechanicsburg Area Senior High School. She identified talents in the social and artistic areas, as well as spiritual gifts of evangelism and musical expression. Building on her gifts and her interest in history, Tace chose for her project to select photographs from our congregation's past and to have them printed on canvas. These photos have been on display on a wall of the church and have been very well received. One way in which Tace would like to support the church's mission is through being involved with the Second Saturday meal.

Mekayla Reinfeld will enter ninth grade at Cumberland Valley High School next fall. Her gifts and personality type mean that she enjoys working with others and helping them feel welcomed and connected, especially on a one-on-one level. Drawing on these gifts, she chose a "guardian angel" project, matching people up in the congregation to build supportive relationships with each other. Mekayla feels called to work toward being a counselor and plans to continue to be active in the life of the congregation.

**Sophia Swartley** will enter tenth grade in Mechanicsburg Area Senior High School next year. Sophia is inquisitive and enjoys engaging and debating big ideas; she also identified writing as both a talent and a spiritual gift. For her project she chose to write an essay reflecting on what it means to be a Lutheran Christian in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Sophia feels called to teach and would like to serve at Trindle Spring by being involved in Christian education ministries.

In their baptisms, God claimed these young people as God's own and made incredible promises to them to forgive them, renew them, gift them for mission, and give them abundant life. Their parents, sponsors, and you, the church, also made promises, to raise them in the Christian faith and support them in their lives of discipleship. At this point in their lives, we glimpse all these promises being kept and coming to fruition. In the service of Affirmation of Baptism, the confirmands had the opportunity to claim God's baptismal gifts in their own voices. They affirmed that they "intend to continue in the covenant God made with [them] in holy baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the Word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth." They will continue in this way of life, alongside us and all their brothers and sisters in Christ throughout the world.

Please pray for these confirmands as they continue to grow in their faith and discipleship. I encourage you to get to know them, if you don't already, and to affirm the gifts God has given them, encouraging them and learning from them as they serve both here in the congregation and beyond.
