The third group to thank is the Finance Committee for putting so much work into our budget proposal.

At this meeting much conversation was had and decisions made in regard to our church property. The bulk of this work was organized by Chuck Sterling and the Property Committee. We also had a revised Constitution and Bylaws that we did not get to vote on at this meeting, but we will do that soon. The small but dedicated team who worked on those revisions are Joanna McIntyre and Robin Cleaver.

I wanted to let you know that as a follow up to our congregational meeting we have a need to vote again for Church Council members. We had a nominee that needed to remove themselves from the ballot, but that did not happen until after the early service had voted. In order to ensure fair voting we are going to vote again during the worship services on December 11th. Thank you for your understanding. Those elected will be announced as quickly afterward as possible. As we set dates for subsequent meetings about the Constitution, Bylaws, and property related items, you will be notified.

SAFETY & SECURITY







Hello Church Family,

I have more than 20 years working in the Emergency Services, so I want to start with a tip. If you have a cell phone, cordless phone or medical alarm, please carry it with you if at all possible when you are in or around your home. Emergencies happen everywhere, even the bathroom! Just please carry you cell phone even at home - your life may depend on it.

I would like to thank Cheryl Guinther, our Parish Administrator, for the suggestion for this article. Have you ever wondered or worried what happens if I fall or have a medical emergency requiring First Responders to get into my house and I can't unlock my door? First Responders will get in, but it could cause damage if there is not a key accessible. Generally there will be a broken window or damaged lock, but when lives are in the balance, time matters. Some have neighbors or family with spare keys or hide a key outside. Hiding a key isn't always safe. Your second choice might be the family member or neighbor with the spare key. They must be notified and be present with it when responding crews arrive so it doesn't delay care. Imagine having a stroke, severe bleeding (you can bleed out from a severe spurting wound in 3 minutes) or heart attack - time is important. Now let's say your family member with the spare key is 20, 30, 40 or more minutes away, or your neighbor with the spare is on vacation or grocery shopping, or you just can't get them to answer their phone. For those living in Apartment Complexes or other types of living centers, most have a method for First Responders to enter the building and may even have master keys that allow access to all apartments once we get inside. If you're not sure check with your building or housing manager. I've seen small locking key boxes outside apartment doors. Generally, alarm companies or County 911 systems will relay this information to the Responders, along with location and codes to the locking boxes.

For those who aren't aware, Knox Box is 1 method of securing a key to your residence accessible by First Responders. It's your house key inside a small secure vault, that can only be unlocked by First Responders. Knox Box is a commercially available product. They work with local municipalities and the units that are keyed specific to the municipality you live in. When purchasing a Knox Box you will need to know who your local Fire Department is so the Knox Box can be keyed for that Department. You must order through Knox Box. Depending on the model required by your municipality, costs for a Knox Box can range from \$200-\$800, plus installation cost. Following the purchase before installation you will need to contact your municipality regarding mounting location or requirements. Expensive? Yes. Secure? Yes. Cost for repairs if forcible entry is required? It may be comparable. The value of the life on the other side of that door? Priceless!

There are other less expensive, relatively safe methods available for spare key storage. As I mentioned, key boxes with punch codes, one manufacturer is Kidde. You may give up some of the security of the Knox Box, but \$30 and a few screws that you mount yourself or have someone else put up may fit your budget. Again, medical alarm companies and County 911 will generally relay the codes and location of these to Responders so we can get in without forcing entry.
