The season of Advent is often known for haunting melodies, apocalyptic imaginations, longing for change, and a whole lot of waiting. But what if Advent is more about a demand, an immediate and urgent call for something different?

This Advent, we are going to approach the season a little differently. Scripture promises us that Jesus is always in our midst—so "Why Wait?" As we prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate seeing Jesus come among us as a tiny baby, we can also actively look for Jesus in the here and now. With our weekly themes of "Come Now," "Comfort Now," "Lament Now," and "Peace Now" we will explore together all the ways Jesus is already active in our lives every day. We hope you will take advantage of our Advent offerings, and that they help you to recognize God's presence in your life. And we hope that through this practice, your celebration of Jesus' Incarnation may be made even more meaningful.

Mondays in Advent: Video Reflection

Wednesdays in Advent: Worship

On Wednesday, December 6, and Wednesday, December 13, we will gather at 7pm for Holden Evening Prayer in the Sanctuary. On Wednesday, December 20, we will gather at 7pm for our Longest Night Service. If you are not familiar with this service, it is a time where we pause in worship to acknowledge that while Christmas is a time for celebration, many people also find themselves feeling pain, loneliness, and sadness. This service gives space to acknowledge those feelings, bring them to God, and pray that we would find light in our darkness. We hope you will set aside time during this busy season to join us for worship—and please bring a friend who might find them meaningful!

Council President noted that the "expedited process" used in the call process for an Associate Pastor did meet all synod guidelines.

Sabbatical Team

A few months ago the Personnel Committee drafted a Sabbatical Policy that was then adopted by the Church Council. I am very thankful for the work of the Personnel Committee on this policy as well as Church Council's approval. My plan is to take advantage of the opportunity to take a 3 month sabbatical most likely in the summer to early fall of 2025.

As part of that policy, a pastor must submit a proposal outlining what they plan to do on their sabbatical for approval by the Church Council. A solid sabbatical plan includes time for relaxation and renewal, as well as continuing education. I have put together a small team of people to help me with this plan. I am very grateful for the willingness of Pastor Martha Boyd, Dallas Epply, Deby Lefin, Karl Heimbach, and Deb Rider to serve on this team. I want to thank them in advance for their partnership in making a sabbatical happen, and for their work ensuring that it is beneficial for both me and the congregation. We will be keeping you informed of our work in the coming months.


