Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is amazing to watch "THE CHURCH" show up. In times of crisis, we rely on the grace, strength, kindness, and faith of others to carry us through. From the moment I heard the news of Deacon Leanne's death, the Lower Susquehanna Synod staff, including Bishop Dunlop, have been in touch with me on an almost daily basis, and their support has been amazing. Standing in the pulpit at Deacon Leanne's funeral service it was inspiring to see the number of people from the different congregations that she had been connected with over the years, the friends and family, and the colleagues who showed up en masse. It was clearly evident how many lives she impacted during her all too short lifetime. I want to offer a big thank you to all who took part in the service or luncheon in any way. Offering hospitality to all those people was a group effort, and our volunteers went above and beyond in their efforts.

Over the past two weeks we have had members of the Synod Staff and other rostered leaders around for conversation with anyone wishing for some pastoral conversation. We've been able to offer times to meet with parents, youth, staff, and church leadership in order to process the traumatic nature of losing Deacon Leanne, as well as beginning to plan on how to best cover the areas of ministry that she worked with. As those plans come into more clear focus we will share them with the congregation. I do want to let you know that the goal of the staff and congregational leadership is that we take the time we need to grieve, but also continue in making progress. We don't want to lose any momentum or direction that Deacon Leanne had helped to create.

I know people have asked the question "when do we look at bringing someone new onto the staff?" In reality, probably not very soon. We first need to grieve and allow those most effected by her death to have the time they need to process this loss. We as a church family then need to reexamine the needs of our congregation and decide how to best fill the ministry needs with staffing.

The synod has provided a grief counselor for us as a congregation. She has been a wonderful resource for the staff as we began to make plans for dealing with our grief. She will also be coming to Trindle Spring sometime in March to lead a workshop on grief and loss. More details on this workshop will be sent out as we continue planning. In the meantime, if you find yourself in need of a pastoral conversation, please reach out. No one should grieve alone. At the same time, I ask you to be patient with your church staff and pray for us as we grieve the loss of a beloved friend and coworker. May God continue to walk this road with us, even in our grief.



TSLC COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS JANUARY 10, 2023



A motion was approved for the Finance Committee to develop policies and procedures of financial guidelines for the budget and surplus monies. John Eberly (Finance Committee Liaison) will take the lead to initiate this process.

A new member conversation will be held on January 29, 2023, between the two worship services. Council will hold a meeting at the Council Retreat on February 11, 2023, to vote in new members. The congregation will receive new members during the worship services on February 12, 2023.

A Special Congregational Meeting will be held following the late services on March 12, 2023, to address the following agenda items: approval of the revised Constitution and Bylaws, a designation of funds for the steeple removal and roof repairs (14 State Road).

As some point in every Christian's life, they discover a question. You know the kind. Not like, "How are you?" Or, "What kind of toothpaste should I buy?" But, like, Why does terrible stuff happen to people who do their best to follow God? Or, How do I know what God wants me to do next?

In our experience, people often feel isolated when they discover that type of question, as if they are the only one asking it. For whatever reason, questions like this often feel forbidden, out-of-bounds. But what if faith requires us to ask questions?

Utilizing materials developed by Barn Geese Worship and adapted by our staff, this Lent we will be exploring questions of faith together as a congregation. There will be many opportunities for members to engage in this important faith practice of asking questions—and we pray you will take advantage of them as we journey together toward the cross.

ASH WEDNESDAY WORSHIP:

On Ash Wednesday, February 22, we will offer two services, 8am and 7pm. Both services will include Holy Communion and Imposition of Ashes. All are encouraged to attend as we begin our Lenten pilgrimage together as a congregation.

LENTEN DAILY DEVOTIONS

A Lenten Daily Devotional booklet will be available for your personal use or to use as a family. These devotions come from Barn Geese Worship, with some additions and changes made by our staff to make it more personal to our congregation. These devotional booklets will be available for you to pick up at the church by Sunday, February 19.

MIDWEEK OPPORTUNITIES

Each Wednesday during Lent, beginning February 22nd and ending March 29th, there will be an opportunity for a meal & time for fellowship and reflection both at noon and in the evening.

From 12-1pm, the Mechanicsburg Council of Churches is having a Wednesday Lunch and Service event from noon to 1pm. This year, Trindle Spring Lutheran Church will be hosting these events. Each week a different church will be providing a light lunch (i.e. soup/sandwich), and their Pastor will be giving a meditation to the group. There is a sign-up sheet on the office bulletin board for you to indicate which weeks you would like to attend. This assists with food preparation, but signing up is not necessary to attend. There will be a good will offering each week to help cover the cost of the meals. If you have any questions, please contact Chuck Sterling at 717-395-7643.

On Wednesday evenings, you are invited to gather with your church family for a meal and conversation beginning at 6pm. Each week a different committee will provide the dinner, beginning on Ash Wednesday with Church Council serving Baked Ziti. While you are enjoying your meal, you are encouraged to engage in conversation with those around you about the "Question of the Week," which will be displayed on each table. Share with your friends and family your thoughts on the question, and listen to theirs to gain a new perspective. Then, at 7pm, we will gather in the Sanctuary for Holden Evening Prayer. During this worship service, Pastor Aaron will offer a reflection on the "Question of the Week."

NEW EXPERIENCES DURING WORSHIP:

One of the last things our program staff did together before the tragic loss of Deacon Leanne was to spend the day planning out what we prayed would be a meaningful Lenten season, helping our church family to embrace questions of faith and experience God in a new way. The readings for Lent this year are very long, especially the Gospel readings, so instead of having just one reader read them to us, we will be trying some different approaches, including multiple readers and congregational participation. In addition, in order to give everyone the opportunity to listen more fully and intently to the readings, they will not be printed in the bulletin during Lent. The Scriptures were meant to be proclaimed and listened to, so for a season we will experience what that is like. Both these ideas were ones that Deacon Leanne came up with and was excited about—so as a tribute to her, we as a congregation will try them with an open mind and heart, praying God uses them to teach us something new.

SOCIAL MEDIA OFFERINGS

An excellent way to engage questions of faith is through discussion with others who are also seeking to understand God better. Social media is a great way for us to continue to do this during the week and not just on Sundays or at Midweek services. We hope that all our TSLC members will take the opportunity to join in exploring questions with us on social media this Lent.

ON FACEBOOK:

Several times each week (usually Monday, Wednesday & Friday), a question of faith will be posted on the TSLC Facebook page. All are encouraged to share their thoughts on the questions and learn from other's perspectives as well.

ON INSTAGRAM:

Each Monday, we will post a "Question of the Week" on the TSLC Instagram page. Then throughout the week, staff members will post a picture and comments about their take on that week's question. You are encouraged to reflect on their offerings in the comments. In addition, TSLC members are encouraged to take a picture and share the question and their thoughts to their own Instagram page, using the hashtag #TSLCask to tag the TSLC page.

LENTEN APPEAL 2023

One thing we don't question about our faith is God's call to serve others in God's name. We do that in many ways, including our Lenten Appeal. This year the Outreach Committee has chosen *JFT Recovery & Veterans Support Services* as the beneficiary of our Lenten appeal. JFT is a non-profit organization devoted to offering safe, structured and compassionate services focusing on Veterans. They do this through their Warm Handoff Program, Recovery and Reentry, Veterans Programs, Housing Programs, Education/Vocation/Job Training Programs, food banks, clothing closets and more. They have locations in Millersburg, Lemoyne, and York.

Along with your monetary donations, we will also be collecting the following items: shampoo, conditioner, body wash, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes, and new socks and underwear in all sizes. Please deposit those items in the bins in the narthex (bins will be available starting Ash Wednesday). Monetary donations can be made electronically or by using the blue envelopes found in the pews - please be sure to note JFT or Lenten Appeal in the memo line on your check!

Family Promise Needs You!

For many people in our community, sudden homelessness is a reality. This is tragic, and even more so for those with families, as most shelters split families up between multiple locations. Family Promise seeks to provide a safe place where families facing homelessness can remain together, receive the support they need, and work toward regaining independence. They do this by partnering with congregations to provide meals and lodging for the families each night. Our first week of serving as a host church for 2023 is March 12-19. We will need many volunteers to make this a success - from people to drive the Family Promise families to and from the Day Center on Erford Rd in Camp Hill, to those who will provide dinner for the families and those who will serve as overnight hosts. We ask you to prayerfully consider volunteering your time to this crucial ministry to families in our community. If you are available and want to help, consider signing up through the "Time to Sign Up" link on our church website. We are always looking for new people to get involved in this crucial ministry.

MEALS ON WHEELS

Founded in March 1969, Mechanicsburg Area Meals on Wheels is believed to be the 2nd Oldest Meals on Wheels operation in the USA. 70% of the funding for this vital community program that currently serves 175 seniors in the greater Mechanicsburg area comes from the community. They deliver a cold and hot meal three days per week. Unless prohibited by weather, the only day during the year that they do not serve meals is on Christmas Day. They serve meals every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, whether it's a holiday or not, except on Christmas Day. However, clients still receive TWO hot meals just prior to Christmas Day.

With rising inflation, especially impacting food prices, the funding situation at MAMOW has become more critical. At least a third of the clients they serve cannot afford to pay any of the \$91/mo charge (\$7/day). Another percentage can only afford to pay a portion of that fee. Karen shared with me that their budget for food costs last year was \$20,000 higher than was budgeted and 2023 prices are showing a similar trend.

As an extension of what we do for the community through our 2nd Saturday community meal ministry, we are embarking on an information effort in our congregation, highlighting the needs of MAMOW and how our members and congregation can get involved to help them in their dedicated service to faithfully feed the seniors in our community. You will be hearing more about their needs in the months to come. At present, TSLC does not support MAMOW.

One way we can support them in the near future is by providing dessert once a month as a congregation. They have openings on the 1st Monday of each month and the 4th Wednesday of each month. Serving 175 would involve preparing twelve 9 x 13 pans of cake or other kind of panned dessert, that is cut into 15 servings each. I have a sign up sheet on the bulletin board outside the office for anyone interested in helping to make this happen and to indicate which of those two choices you would prefer. I'm looking forward to seeing what we can accomplish together! ~Deb Bender, Parish Life Chairperson


