Friends in Christ,

As hard as it is to believe, Lent is almost upon us. Lent is a time for reflection, a time for simplification, and a time for us as Christians to focus on our faith. Our theme for this year is "Again and Again." Again and again brokenness seems to find us, again and again we are in need of repentance and God's forgiveness, again and again God has chosen us and calls us to be his people. Again and again the story of Jesus' actions on the cross shape who we are and the story we tell of God's love. On pages 2 and 3 you will read much more about our Lenten theme, opportunities for worship, and other times to connect with one another and with God.

There is another ministry that we have been working on and will begin to roll out during Lent. I want to take a moment to tell you about it. We know that grief is a normal part of life, and everyone experiences and deals with grief differently. Sometimes grief lasts a long time, and you need help to manage it. Grief can be caused by the death of a loved one, the loss of a job, the experience of a divorce, and many other circumstances. As a congregation, we want to be able to support each other in our grief. Our "Cup of Hope" ministry and medical binders are what began many of these conversations, and they will continue as they have in the past. However, there are some new aspects to our "Grief Ministry" you should know about. This ministry has several pieces to it, but in each opportunity personal conversations are to be kept confidential.

The first opportunity we are offering is "Lunch and Listen." These will be groups of 4-5 people who simply go out to lunch together as often as they would like to. Individuals can sign up for this ministry during the month of February. The groups will then be assigned and can start going out for meals together. The intent is to simply be a support, as needed.

The second opportunity will begin in April. This will be a four session, more structured support group that will meet at the church for conversation and work on processing grief together. The goal is to offer this twice a year. The first times will be April and May, when the group will meet every other week. Look for more specifics about this ministry in the next newsletter.

Third, be sure to watch for "Monday Morning Messages" to begin this spring as well. They will be simple quotes or short readings posted to Facebook that relate to grief.

Lastly, we are working on compiling a list of resources that can help people in times of grief. The goal is to curate a list of counselors, websites, books, and other valuable information and contacts that people can utilize as needed. If you have found a resource to be helpful to you, please let us know and we can add it to our resources, because it may be helpful for someone else too.

We pray that these ministry offerings will be a help to you and we will continue to offer prayers for you in your journey.

Lent 2024 - "Again & Again"

In Lent, we're reminded that, again and again, suffering and brokenness find us. We doubt again, we lament again, we mess up again. Again and again, the story of Jesus on the cross repeats—every time lives are taken unjustly, every time the powerful choose corruption and violence, every time individuals forget how to love. With exacerbation we exclaim, "Again?! How long, O God?" And yet, in the midst of the motion blur chaos of our lives, God offers a sacred refrain: "I choose you, I love you, I will lead you to repair." Again and again, God breaks the cycle and offers us a new way forward.

This theme provides a clear invitation in a time when much is unclear. We come to God again and again with our prayers, our dreams, our hopes, and our doubts. We will continue to be community to one another—especially when it's hard—by choosing each other over and over again. We will continue to love God with the same persistence God chooses and claims us. Our sub-theme, A Lenten Refrain, speaks to the ways God can make music of our lives. "Refrain" also reminds us that Lent is a season of abstaining from certain or harmful practices in order to take on new rhythms and habits. This year during Lent, we will use materials from *Sanctified Art* to help us on our Lenten journey. Please read over the many ways you are invited to see what God is teaching us. Join us this Lent as again and again, we bring all of who we are to God and trust that God will meet us, time and again, along the way.

Ash Wednesday Worship:

On Ash Wednesday, February 14, we will be offering two services, one at 12pm and one at 7pm. Both services will include Holy Communion and Imposition of Ashes. All are encouraged to attend so that we can enter into our Lenten season together as a church family.

Midweek Worship

Each Wednesday during Lent, beginning February 21st and ending March 27th, there will be an opportunity for a meal & time for fellowship and reflection. At 5:30pm, all are welcome to gather in the Fellowship Hall for a meal and conversation inspired by artwork that corresponds to that week's scripture reading. Then, at 7pm, we will gather in the Sanctuary for Holden Evening Prayer. Join us!

Congregational Prayer Wall Project

This Lent, we invite you to come to God in prayer again and again, weaving your prayers in with the prayers of your community to create a beautiful prayer wall. Woven together, your prayers will form the shape of an ampersand, representing God's holy "and." When we become weary from the motion blur chaos of our lives, God promises that there is always more to the story—death does not have the last word. When we feel helpless and hopeless, God's holy "and" encourages us to lift our weary eyes to search for more. This Lent, let us practice the power of 'and' as we sink into the repetition and ritual of prayer.

The Prayer Wall will be introduced on Ash Wednesday in the narthex, and will include directions. We will also be talking more about it in worship, Sunday School, and will post an introductory video to our social media pages. We hope you will join us in this project!

Lenten Devotional Offerings

This year, we will be offering two different options for Lenten devotionals. We invite you to pick which one best suits your needs, or you can even try both! The first is a weekly devotional booklet. This booklet follows the Revised Common Lectionary to choose the readings for each week, and each week offers 3-4 entries that may include written reflections, commentary, visual art, poetry, and/or coloring pages. The second is daily devotional cards. This set of 48 cards cover every day from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday. Each card displays a word and scripture verse on the front, with reflection prompts and prayer on the back side. Both of these devotional offerings will be available **beginning on February 11**, and we hope you will make use of them.

Adult Sunday School Offering - Faith and Preparing for End of Life

It is when we are grieving the loss of a loved one that we often turn to God, and plead for answers to why we must face grief and loss, again and again. And again and again, God meets us there, comforts us, and helps us to move forward. We trust and rely on this truth. But what about our family and friends when we are gone? One of the most loving things we can do for our loved ones is to make decisions about end of life matters before we are gone, instead of leaving them to deal with it in their grief.

Pastor Aaron and Pastor Martha will be facilitating a 4-week series during the Sunday School hour on preparing for end of life. This series will run from March 3—March 24, 2024. It will include discussion about how we as Christians view and talk about death and dying, a workshop led by a local attorney on estate planning, living wills, power of attorney and other legal matters, a workshop by a local funeral director on preplanning and prepaying for your funeral, as well as Pastor Aaron and Pastor Martha leading a discussion on how you can preplan your funeral service and the importance of doing so. We have members who serve our community through this organization, and we also have members who are the recipients of the meals provided. Your donations will be accepted throughout the Lenten season, beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 14, and lasting through Easter Sunday. If you normally make your church donations online, a donation to the Lenten Appeal can be done in this way as well.

WHEN SHOULD I CALL THE PASTOR?

As Pastors we are called to be with people in all times. Joy, sorrow, pain, grief, celebration, birth, death, and everything in between. Understanding that we can't be with everyone all the time, when exactly does the Pastor need to know what's going on with me, and when might I need a visit, whether it is by telephone or in-person?

You may need Pastoral Care if:

- You have a serious health event that takes you to the hospital, rehab center, or changes where you will live, either temporarily or permanently.
- You are experiencing a major life event, like job loss, death, birth, or a relationship change.
- You are having questions about faith or the church.
- You are sensing a call to serve the church in a particular way.
- You or a family member want to be a member of the church, be baptized, or receive holy communion.

Why should I call the Pastor?

We want to support, encourage, pray, and care for you in this journey of life and faith, and so does the congregation. Living in Christian community means sharing in both the joys and sorrows of life. We are bound together as a community in Christ, and with your permission, we would like to share with the congregation how we can best pray for and support you in times of need.

What happens in a Pastoral Visit?

When we visit you, whether it be in a hospital, rehab center, retirement community, or your home, we will listen to what is going on in your life and have conversation or offer quiet presence. We may offer prayer, scripture reading and communion. Depending on your situation, some visits may be longer than others, and more frequent. We hope our visits provide peace and comfort, amid any anxiousness, fear, or uncertainty that some life-changing events bring.

What is Homebound Visitation?

Homebound visitation is for those in our community who are no longer able to come to worship on a regular basis because of health or other limitations. It may be a temporary situation, like recovery or rehab. Or it may be permanent, like when you are no longer able to drive or perform usual daily activities by yourself. Whether it's temporary or permanent, Pastor Martha will visit you regularly—every 4 or 5 weeks. If your situation is short-term, or increases in severity, visits will be more frequent.

Who do I contact?

Contact the church office or Pastor Aaron for Pastoral Care, or Pastor Martha for Homebound Visitation. Please leave a message if we are unable to answer the phone.

It is helpful for us to know:

- Your name and contact information
- Your situation or your family members' situation
- If you're in the hospital or other facility, the facility name/location, and room number.
- If you would like a prayer request (including what details), to get placed on our prayer email.

Sabbatical Team Update

The Sabbatical Team, along with Pastor Aaron, is currently working on what Pastor Aaron's sabbatical might look like. Clergy sabbaticals are intended to be a balance of rest, relaxation, and rejuvenation, as well as a time for some continuing education and discernment about how God is calling us to continue to grow in faith and serve our community. In addition, congregations often schedule corresponding opportunities within the congregation while the Pastor is away. The team is looking at all these possibilities, and gathering input from congregational members on what might best serve us going forward.

Pastor Aaron is applying for a Clergy Renewal Grant from the Lilly Foundation that would allow him and his family to include some travel (both educational and recreational) and educational opportunities during his sabbatical that would not be financially feasible otherwise. The deadline for this grant is March 13, 2024. Therefore, over next month the team will be hard at work to complete the application and all the corresponding documents before the deadline. The Lilly Foundation announces the recipients in mid-August, so once the application is submitted, there will be a pause in planning until we hear whether Pastor Aaron is granted the award or not.
