May 2023 income was \$41,126, which is a 4% increase from April 2023 and a 13% increase from May 2022.

• Deb Sterling provided a Rostered Leader Sabbatical Leave Policy. Council discussed the policy. A vote on the policy is planned for the July 11, 2023 Council meeting.

GROWING AS Disciples TSLC Summer 2023

This summer at TSLC, we are focusing on growing as disciples of Jesus. Each Sunday in our lectionary readings we are able to hear and learn about what it means to follow Jesus. So far in June we have heard about Jesus choosing his followers from among those society would cast out, breaking Jewish customs to heal those in need, and sending his 12 apostles out into an unknown word to share the Good News—not with just those who fit within the societal norms, but with everyone. Jesus shows us time and time again that being a disciple means reaching beyond ourselves to share God's love with everyone we meet. Being a disciple requires us to go beyond our comfort zone, and to be willing to challenge our own biases and worldviews so that we can better align ourselves with God's will. Being a disciple often comes with a cost—living as a disciple can often cause us to face unexpected conflict and push-back. Being a disciple of Jesus Christ is not an easy path, but each of us are called to it through our Baptism.

Our summer focus on growing as disciples is being guided by the 6 marks of discipleship discussed in our summer book study book, "Real Faith for Real Life" by Michael Foss. These 6 marks of discipleship are: Daily Prayer, Bible Reading, Weekly Worship, Christian Service, Relationships that encourage spiritual growth, and giving in the spirit of generosity. We encourage you to take advantage of any and all of ways of learning and growing that are meaningful to you, and challenge you to step outside your comfort zone and try to grow in an area that might be hard for you. Please refer to the rest of this article for the many ways in which you can get involved in our summer focus on discipleship.

Summer Book Study: Real Faith for Real Life

All those who ordered a copy of Rev. Michael Foss' book through the church can pick them up any time. If you missed ordering one and would like to join us, there are a few extra—first come, first serve, for \$14. We can also get you the information to order one for yourself. Our weekly meetings begin on Wednesday, June 28—in person at the church at 11, and on zoom at 8pm.

Daily Prayer

How would you like to increase or strengthen your prayer life this summer? We encourage you to check out prayer resources available at the church in the narthex. We also encourage you to take your bulletins home each week and spend a little bit of time each day praying for those on our community prayer list. If you would like to join our congregational prayer chain, please contact Linda Yohn. One idea we offer to enhance your prayer life is to keep a prayer journal—write down those people or situations you are praying for, and take time every month to look back on it and see how God has worked through your prayers and the prayers of others in those people's lives and situations. Look for more ideas to help your prayer life on our church social media accounts in the month of July.

Bible Reading—READING PROVERBS IN JULY

There are 31 days in July and 31 chapters in Proverbs. We invite all TSLC members and friends to join the TSLC staff in reading one chapter of Proverbs each day of July. As a way to "touch base" and share our thoughts on this experience, Pastor Aaron (with some cameos from other staff) will post a video each week on the congregation's Facebook page. You can look for this video to be posted each Saturday morning, beginning July 1. These videos will do a recap and share insight on the passages we have read over the week, and preview the upcoming week. You are encouraged to watch these videos, and then comment on them with questions, thoughts and reflections throughout the week so we as a congregation can share in what we are learning through this bible study.

Weekly Worship:

The staff hears all the time about how much people love our one-service Sundays during the summer, as they get to see friends they have missed from attending different services and share in worship and study with their entire church family! We feel the same way and want to see you every week you are in town! But we also know that summers are a time for travelling and exploring new places, visiting family, and taking some time to relax. Some of you will join us from far off places through our livestream. Some of you will join family in their home congregations. And some of you will brave being visitors in an unknown church. We invite you to share these experiences with us! Each Monday, beginning June 26, we will post on social media asking those of you who worshipped elsewhere that past weekend to share something with us—take a picture, tell us a story, whatever you like! We want to know where your travels take you and how God met you there!

Christian Service—TSLC SERVICE BLITZ AUGUST 13!

Have you marked your calendar yet? Sunday, August 13, following worship we will join together as a congregation to serve our community. We plan to have some service opportunities that can be done here at the church for those who want to participate but maybe can't travel off-site or be somewhere without air conditioning. We will also be sending members out into our community to serve those around us. Please plan to make this a part of your summer—and if you have suggestions for ways in which our congregation might be able to serve our community on that day, please let one of the staff members know!

Relationships that Encourage Spiritual Growth: GROWING AS DISCIPLES IN OUR FAMILIES

TSLC offers so many ways to connect with others in our faith family. We encourage to make this a priority this summer—take part in one of the many activities the fellowship committee has planned, sign up for supper clubs, or even just reach out to someone you don't know as well in our congregation and see if they would like to get dinner. Nurturing relationships with people who share our faith is crucial to our growth as disciples.

Parents are the first ones to teach their children about following Jesus, and we strive to help them do that. Almost all of the things mentioned in this article can be incorporated into your family life. To help you do that, each Wednesday, beginning June 28, we will be posting activities on Facebook for families that correlate to one of these marks of discipleship. We hope you take advantage of these as you strengthen the faith relationship you have in your homes. Feel free to share your experiences on Facebook!

With summer travels comes being gone from your home congregation. Please remember to continue your regular offering through the summer months so that TSLC can continue to do its important ministry. Summer Music at TSLC

Come Join Us! Summer is a great time to try out being a part of TSLC Music Ministry programs. Please check out the list of short-term commitments being offered this summer and plan to join us! If you have any questions, please contact Danielle Erdley, Director of Music.

Women's Chorus—open to all treble singers ages high school—102+! We will rehearse on Sunday, June 25, immediately following worship. This choir will provide the anthem for worship on Sunday, July 2.

MONDAY: Beginning Bell Ringers—intended for those who've never run before to learn the basics TUESDAY: Intermediate Bell Techniques—intended for those who have some experience, but would like to improve on techniques such as shakes, tower swing, thumb damps, martellatos, gyros and more.

WEDNESDAY: Advanced Bell Techniques—intended for semi-seasons ringers who would like to work on techniques such as 4-in hand, ringing bass bells, and other techniques specific to advanced bell work.

THURSDAY (Evening Only): A Night of Ringing—some and sight-read from new music with ringers from around the area!

This concert series promises to be a wonderful outreach into our community, and we are excited about what is ahead.

Much of this year was figuring out what works, what doesn't, and deciding how to best make this concert series a success. We were blessed with many generous memorial donations that made this initial season possible financially and gave us the room to learn without worrying about how the bills would get paid. The concert series would not have been possible without these memorial gifts from the family and friends of Robert Kimmel, Tom Kerstetter, Joe Ricci, Marlin Yohn, Sr., Carmen Wagner and Ron Albert. We are so grateful.

What we have discovered over this past year is that in order to keep the concert series going and financially independent (not relying on TSLC budgetary funds or continued memorial gifts), we will need to have income sources other than just the free will offerings taken at concerts. We will be beginning a sponsorship program where individuals and/or businesses are able to make a yearly donation towards the concert series. These sponsors will be recognized in each concert's program and will have other perks as well—that are yet to be determined. While ALCM offers many online and in-person conferences and workshops locally and regionally throughout the year, their primary gathering is their biennial National Conference, which takes place this year from July 5-8 in Philadelphia. Danielle Erdley, our director of music, will be attending, and will take part in worship, workshops, lectures, and discussion panels to further her knowledge of church music and how to best lead our congregation's music ministry.
