Friends in Christ,

It has been so nice to hear you all singing once again on Sunday mornings during worship. I know that there is increased anxiety in our community and around the country about the rise of COVID cases once again. With that in mind, I want to extend a word of grace. I have had a few people contact me to say they were sorry about not being back in worship yet. That isn't necessary, as people need to resume things at their own pace and with their own feelings of safety. I want to reiterate that this is a time when we need to continue to be gracious with one another (unlike much of our world right now.) We need to be the example of Christian grace, compassion, and understanding in a world full of impatience and intolerance. So, when you are ready to be back in person, we will welcome you with open arms (or a handshake). Until then, I do hope that you continue to connect with worship online, and certainly reach out if you are in need of a pastoral visit.

In an effort to safely connect more people with worship once again, we are going to be bringing back our Wednesday night worship service. Starting Wednesday, October 6th at 7pm, we will be back in the sanctuary for this service of Bible Study and Communion. The service will look a little different than it did in the past though. This service will be a spoken brief liturgy. There will be a time for Bible study instead of a homily, and then we will end with Holy Communion. It is my hope that this worship opportunity will be a more comfortable option for those who may be hesitant to be back in the sanctuary on a full Sunday morning with singing. It might also be a good opportunity for people to come in the middle of a hectic week and be refueled with word and sacrament. This tends to be a smaller service, so people can easily distance to their comfort level. If you've never been before, give it a try- and I hope to see many of our regulars there, too.

The last thing from me this month is just a reminder that most ministries are back in full swing. Sunday School has started, youth ministry, confirmation, opportunities for service, and most of our other regular activities have resumed. If you are looking for a way to connect, come talk to me and we will see if we can find a ministry to fit your interests. The other side of that is with renewed activities comes additional expenses. We noted at church council this past month that giving compared to last year is down about 7%. That may not sound like much, but as we work on preparing the budget for next year, that could have a significant impact on the 2022 budget. We are still in the black this year, and financially we are still doing fine, but we need to make sure that it stays that way. I am grateful to you, as a congregation, for your faithful giving throughout COVID. Many congregations have had a terribly rough 18 months or so, and we have managed to weather that storm well. I am excited about this programmatic year and the energy that we will continue to build on as we move forward together.

Many of the students are not back on campus and are doing their education remotely. **TSLC COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS
SEPTEMBER 14, 2021**



Covid-19 Update:

Property Committee: - There have been no changes to the scheduled reopening of both worship services indoors: 8:00 AM and 9:30AM will be indoors with singing and rail communion. The following recommendations for conducting Sunday School were made and approved: All people in the Education wing hallways will be required to wear masks. Adults in the Crossroads class may remove masks once they are in their room. Teachers and all youth, regardless of vaccination status, will be required to wear masks at all times. Youth will not be allowed to visit the Crossroads class to get donuts as there will be no eating in the hallways or classrooms Dots Publik Pizza Place attended the meeting to request of letter of agreement with their plans to expand their business to a Micro Brewery in Trindle Commons sometime in the future. Council agreed to this.

New Council Members: Jan Ingraham was elected to fill the remainder of 2021 for Jerry Frankenfield and Deb Sterling was elected to fill the remainder of 2021 for Pat Beaver. The council thanks them and the other candidates who came forward to do this important work.

ELCA Update: The first congregational meeting to discuss the ELCA structure has been set for the afternoon of October 17. There will then be monthly meetings as needed to address established ELCA projects and partnerships and how this money is used, and most recent Social Statements/Stances/Ministries of the ELCA.

Wednesday Evening Worship Service: Within the next few weeks, at the conclusion of the current Wednesday evening Bible Study, in person Wednesday evening services will resume. The format will change to an entirely spoken service with the sermon being a short Bible study.

Altar Flowers: Due to an increase in the cost of flowers for all florists, the price of sponsoring the altar flowers or a basket will raise to \$50 beginning with the first Sunday in November.

Communion and Reader Sign-ups: To make signing up easier for these opportunities to participate in our worship services, there will be someone in the narthex on the 3rd Sunday of each month to assist you with signing up electronically. You will still be able to sign up on line from home if that is more convenient.



FAMILY PROMISE "REMOTE" HOSTING 4TH QTR 2021



FROM THE SAFETY & SECURITY TEAM

Church Family,

I pray this finds you all doing and feeling well. I'd also like to take a minute to thank generous donors, who would like to remain anonymous, for their donations which made it possible to purchase a monitor for the office wall and an updated computer for Safety and Security. Both items are being used with the Security Camera system.

In a few recent mailings I have mentioned the new Access System at the Church. Allow me to reiterate-if you need to get into the church and previously used a key to unlock doors to do so, you may need to get in touch with either Chuck Sterling or me. We do understand not everyone needs a key or a pass to unlock the church. Currently the 3 main entrances used by members are unlocked exclusively by the keyless system. Your key does not work. There are plans to change a few other entrances in the future so all exterior doors will either use keyless entry or will be keyed differently. This is due to the many keys that are not able to be accounted for.



As more members are returning to services, I'd like to remind you of some good Safety and Security procedures to follow. We have had 2 recent incidences at our facility. Although these individuals were caught, we need to remember and follow some rules, so no one becomes a victim.

Make sure your vehicle is locked and all valuables concealed.



If it will be dark when you arrive or leave, park in a well-lit area. We recently adjusted the exterior building lights to be on from dusk till dawn.

If you're alone and there is a stranger in the parking lot when you want to leave, stay inside the building where you are secure. Likewise, if you arrive at the church in your car and see someone strange hanging around, stay in your locked car or leave.

When in Committee Meetings or Events, church doors should be locked. Have someone stay by the door waiting for all attendees to arrive. The recent incidents occurred while people were meeting in the Church. If possible, use the Buddy system; we teach our kids to have a Buddy with them. As adults, it's still a good idea to not be alone.

Don't become complacent simply because it's not dark. The recent incidences occurred in daylight hours. While not an "at church" rule, if you leave here or anywhere and see a vehicle following you, do not drive home. Call 911 and have a Police Officer meet you somewhere in a well-lit, public area.

Be vigilant. If you see something suspicious let someone know.




